The Traumatic Loneliness of Children

Most parents have great difficulty understanding and making real communication with their children because all adults have repressed and forgotten their own childhood. This often results in the creation of two different worlds that run parallel, though infrequently overlap, prompting parents to resort to one of three modes of reaction: i) ignoring children, ii) trying to change them into adults, or iii) becoming impatient and sometimes violent. From the vertex of the child, all of these reactions amount to feelings of unfair treatment, non-existence, but mostly loneliness.

Rafael López-Corvo, MD is a Training and Supervising Psychoanalyst of the International Psychoanalytic Association, Canadian and Venezuelan Psychoanalytic Societies. He was former Associate Professor at Ottawa and McGill Universities and Program Director of Child and Adolescents Unit at the Douglas Hospital, McGill University. Dr. López-Corvo has been on the editorial board of the International Journal of Psycho-Analysis for Latin-America. He has published over 100 articles, several book chapters and 22 books, published internationally in the areas of child development, group dynamics, femininity, addictions, and self-envy, to name a few. Dr. López-Corvo is a scholar in the psychoanalytic approach of Wilfred Bion.



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
