About the Program

If you are a psychotherapist – or have an academic interest in psychoanalytic psychotherapy and psychoanalysis – and you want to learn more about the theories that started it all, then this introductory program has been designed for you. This is a thirty-three week course, offered one evening per week for two hours, that combines the teaching of basic concepts of psychoanalytic psychotherapy with explanatory clinical examples. The major psychoanalytic theories will be described. We have found that understanding such psychoanalytic concepts as transference and counter-transference can be of great help in making sense of interactions with patients and clients, no matter what your preferred modality of treatment, and can also be applied to many non-clinical professional situations.

This unique program is offered by the Toronto Psychoanalytic Society in response to the growing interest of individuals who want more than their clinical education has offered to date, or to non-clinical people who have developed an interest in reading about and discussing the ideas and theories of psychoanalysis and psychoanalytic therapy. This is not a training program; however, it provides an excellent introduction to the core concepts for people who may be interested in training. All our classes are taught by analysts who are members of our Society and are held on Thursday evenings, from 7:30 to 9:30 pm, from September to April.

This Program is open to anyone who has an interest in psychoanalysis, and who has a professional degree, preferably a Masters Degree. Clinical experience and personal therapy are always an asset. All applicants will be interviewed by a member of the Committee.
