Canadian psychoanalyst Endre Koritar will join Irish analyst Ian Miller for an engaging discussion about how psychoanalysis helps us understand what the speakers refer to as "the Trump phenomenon." Their dialogue will investigate the relationship between the individual psyche and the culture of the populace (i.e., the polis). It will consider the complex effect of Donald Trump on his followers, specifically, the underlying dynamics of hypnotic influence and the creation of an alternate reality.

Endre Koritar MD is a training and supervising psychoanalyst with the Western Canada Psychoanalytic Institute, Clinical Assistant Professor, University of British Columbia, Dept Psychiatry. He is on the Board of Directors of the International Sándor Ferenczi Network, the National Council of the Canadian Psychoanalytic Society, the National Training Committee, and is an Associate Editor of the American Journal of Psychoanalysis.

lan Miller PhD is a clinical psychologist/ psychoanalyst, Dublin, Ireland, an Associate Editor of the American *Journal of Psychoanalysis* and a member of the Irish Forum for Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy.
